## SUING A BUSINESS IN A SMALL CLAIMS COURT

## Before filing your small claim case, you MUST obtain the business status. Is it a corporation (Inc.), and (LLC), or a (DBA)? You can get this information by contacting the Department of Commerce at: 801-530-4849, or visit their website online at <u>https://secure.utah.gov/bes/</u>.

\*\*If the business is Inc., or an LLC, you CANNOT sue the owner of the business.\*\*

 If the company you are suing is incorporated (Inc.) or a limited liability (LLC) you must have the name and address of the Registered Agent that is on file with the Department of Commerce. (Example below)

## Example:

Name of Defendant: Bob's Car Service, Inc. – or Bob's Car Service, LLC. Agent & Title: John Doe (Registered Agent)

2. If the company you are suing is a "doing business as" or (**DBA**), the Registered Agent information is not applicable. You will have the owner and business name. (Example below)

Name of Defendant: Jane Doe, DBA, Jane Doe's Hair Salon

3. **Military Service Declaration** is NOT required when suing a business. However, if the owner is also named as Co-Defendant in a matter, the Military Service Declaration is required for that individual(s).

## If you are acting as your own attorney, it is your responsibility to research and learn the ODR small claims process. The Court cannot give advice.
